

Announcements

GOAL: Students will be able to stop working and quietly listen to announcements.

RATIONALE 1: Learning to quietly listen to announcements in public settings teaches students to respect others' rights to listen and prepare them for receiving information in such a manner.

3. 1	Students demonstrate positive behaviors ("You do") Students practice positive behaviors only		
(Practice makes permanent, not perfect! Never allow students to practice misbehavior.)

 Student Voice: Students will help choose this as an important classroom Teach-To Student Voice: Students will provide (but not practice) examples of all behaviors Student Voice: Teacher will model positive, negative, and almost-but-not quite behaviors Student Voice: Students will only model positive examples Assessment: Teacher will reteach or revisit as necessary (e.g., after breaks, weekends, etc.) at his/her discretion or when directed by administrators
